They loved teasing me about my Southern accent, and I loved hearing their Scottish accent in return. Those small, joyful moments reflect the warmth and friendship we shared.

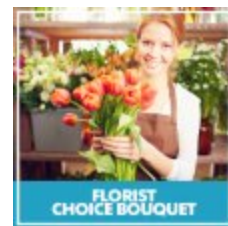
