Hershel Evans Johnson Sr. was born on June 22, 1950. Herschel was the second born child of Elle Ellois and Lloyd Johnson's marriage, after Rayfield, and followed by Tomma, and Roxane. Hershel is the grandson of Clara English and Willard Thornton. His maternal grandparents were Clara English and Willard Thornton. His paternal grandparents were Victoria and Edwin Johnson.

While attending Dunbar elementary school in Kinloch Missouri, he joined the Memorial Lancers Drum and Bugle Corps (1959-1966) as a drummer which played a role in developing his lifelong love for music. A proud Kinlochian, Hershel earned his varsity letter in cross country. Quite the Scholar, Hershel attended Kinloch High School and Webster University, simultaneously as a participant in the dual enrollment program from 1966 to 1968. After graduating from Kinloch in 1968, he went on to attend Lincoln University from 1968 to 1971.

Hershel married his high school sweetheart, Donetha Eldridge, in 1969. Two children were born to Donetha and Hershel; Scharnae, his eldest child and Hershel Johnson, Jr. After 4 years of marriage, Donetha and Hershel divorced in 1973.

During their marriage of 36 years, three boys would be born; Patrick, Lloyd, and his baby boy, Isaac Hershel Johnson.

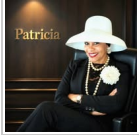
